2. Dear Church... A Video Message from National Bishop Larry Kochendorfer



ELCIC National Bishop Larry Kochendorfer has <u>shared the first video</u> in what he hopes to be a regular feature providing a glimpse into his ministry as National Bishop and that of the work of the National Office.

In the video, Bishop Kochendorfer asks you to mark your calendar for November 30 and

plan to attend a church-wide 'town hall' event currently titled, 'Rooted in Faith, Conversations from Across the Church.' Learn more by watching the video here.

3. Appeal for Support of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land

The ELCIC National Office and Eastern Synod continue their appeal to support the ministries of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL). Our goal is to raise \$50,000 to assist in supporting this vital work that embodies faith, resilience and hope in a just peace. To date we have raised almost \$30,000.

In a recent October 10, 2025 statement from the Patriarchs and Heads of Churches in Jerusalem, the leaders "rejoiced at the recent enactment of the ceasefire in Gaza, and the release of those held captive."

At the same time, they also acknowledged their shared concern regarding, "increasing violence against local communities in the West Bank in connection with settlement expansions." The leaders urged the international community as a whole, "to widen the scope of the current negotiations to include an end of the occupation of both the West Bank and Gaza, leading to the establishment of a Palestinian state living side-by-side in peace with the present State of Israel."

The war between Israel and Hamas has greatly affected our partners in the ELCJHL. Most of them have relatives in Gaza. Restricted movement in the region has continued to impact people's ability to work and move freely resulting in huge financial implications for the church.

Our church's long-standing relationship with the ELCJHL is a vital expression of our shared faith and commitment to justice and peace. You are invited to: pray for peace, learn more about the work of the ELCJHL and give generously to the ELCJHL Appeal.
