2. Communications as Ministry: Christmas

As we enter the seasons of Christmas, our communications become more than reminders and schedules. They are a part of our ministry of welcome and care. In a season filled with expectation and activity, thoughtful communication can be a quiet but powerful act of hospitality. Here are a few thoughts to consider:

1. Share information with care.

Make key details such as service times, locations and special events, easy to find an consistent across bulletins, emails, websites, outdoor signage and social media. Clea communication is a simple but powerful act of welcome. Your members may know where to find details about when services are this week, but <u>individuals who may not</u> know how to pavigate to pewsletters and bulletins will appreciate this information

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being on website homepages and easy to find on social media posts.

2. Highlight the "why."

When sharing information about events or programs, briefly explain why they matter to your congregation or community. People connect more deeply when they understand purpose and meaning.

3. Make it easy to invite others.

Provide simple, shareable information (i.e. graphics, text or links), so members can invite friends, family and neighbours to join in worship and special gatherings.

4. Tell the story of your congregation.

Share glimpses of congregational life. Whether it's up on the screen before worship, on your website or social media channels - consider posting images of volunteers preparing for worship or other gatherings, choir rehearsals, the lighting of candles, etc. ... Share the heart of your ministry!

5. Prepare for the unexpected.

Regardless of where your community might gather, weather and other disruptions ca happen. It can take just a few extra minutes to prepare in advance and have messages ready in case you need to move worship to the livestream, or post change via email, website, or online quickly.
