
# 1. World Week for Peace in Palestine and Israel - September 20-26

Those participating in the sacrament at their locations may wish to have bread and wine/grape juice near them to receive the elements at the appropriate point in the service.


The offering for the day is designated to the <u>ELCJHL Appeal</u> and <u>CLWR's Friends of Creation</u>.

<u>Citizens for Public Justice</u> (CPJ) has released a new report, *Climate-Induced Migration:* Canada's Obligations & Opportunities, written by former CPJ student policy worker Lainie Nichols. The report explores how climate-induced migration - when people are forced to leave their homes due to extreme weather events or slow-onset environmental changes - is already a pressing reality in Canada. In 2023 alone, 200,000 Canadians were displaced by unprecedented wildfires. This report highlights Canada's lack of action in protecting the rights of climate migrants and urges stronger communities. It has been a busy first two weeks for ELCIC's Bishop-elect Larry Kochendorfer, who formally began his call at the National Office on Tuesday, September 2. This past weekend, the bishop-elect attended <u>Canadian Lutheran World Relief</u> (CLWR)'s board of directors meeting. Through our partnership with CLWR, we work together to challenge the causes and respond to the consequences of injustice and poverty.

Also present at the board meeting was Maria Immonen, director of the <u>Lutheran World Federation's Department of World Service</u>. Reflecting on both the Canadian and global context, she highlighted the rapid pace of change and uncertainty many people are experiencing, noting that across Europe individuals are, "looking again to the church to find ways help find meaning and hope in their lives."

"The ELCIC, too, is being challenged to find ways to engage with young people, and people of all ages, looking for community and connection," she said. "In this [the ELCIC] joins LWF member churches all over the world bearing witness to hope in our world today. We look forward to continued collaboration, sharing, walking together."
