

G7 Jubilee People's Forum in Calgary



You've likely seen email from our synods, maybe your congregation, and other organizations about the resurgence of spam email. These messages may ask for personal information, urgent financial help or contain suspicious links. The sender is likely someone who might be familiar to you, but the tone of the email seems off. If an email seems weird, it probably is! Often times, you can spot these emails quickly by just looking at the "sender's" return email address. Spam emails often (but not always) come from an outside, unofficial email address. Please know that we will never contact you in this way. And, we will never ask for personal or financial details via email. If you're ever unsure about a message, please contact our office directly before responding or clicking on a link.
